Kia ora koutou,

Term 3 is an important term in the College for all of our students. For our senior students it is a chance to ensure that they are dotting their 'i's and crossing their 't's in terms of getting their assessments (or if necessary reassessments or resubmissions) completed to get those important credits. Whilst we focus on the learning at Paeroa College the evidence of this is the qualifications. For our Yr11 students, I expect all to have either almost achieved or to have completed their Level 1 qualification by the end of term 3. For our Level 2 and 3 students this is more difficult given the higher number of external exams but I at the least expect them to have achieved half of their necessary credits. For parents you can check this online through the parent portal or through regular discussion with both your child and their Form teacher or Learning Leader. As a reminder, the Learning Leader at Yr11 is Miah Williams and at Yr12 and Y13 is Karen Mclean.

For our Yr9 and Yr10 students we are interested in progress. Good AMPs numbers and clear progression in reading, writing and maths is where it is at. By the end of this term every student should be able to explain where they are in their learning, how it is going and where to next. The junior school is doing a huge amount of work on explaining and clarifying learning progressions and this information will start to come out to parents shortly.

Next week on Monday 8th August is our Home School Partnership. You should have received a phone call from the Tutor teacher and a letter explaining the time of your appointment but if you are not sure or need to reschedule please contact Deb Berry at the school on 862 7579 ext 201 or debb@paeroacollege.school.nz . Please remember that your child is only required at school for the interview. This is the chance to ask your Tutor teacher and your child any questions you might have and find a way to work together to make sure that your child is on track.
