Principal's Comment

Kia ora koutou,

Last week was an absolute pleasure for me personally as I was able to visit the various sports teams that we had on tour during tournament week. We had our Junior Boys and Junior Girls basketball early in the week in Auckland and our UNISS Netball team (Panmure) and Senior Boys basketball (Tauranga) all enjoying a tour. It once again struck me how significant these types of opportunities are for students. As well as the games themselves, the experience of coming away from school and doing something as a team with all of the positive experiences and challenges that this provides are often all too rare and it was great to see the students having the chance. In addition, once again I was reminded of the amazing efforts that volunteers put into the sport so thanks once again to everyone involved.
