Principal's Comment

Kia ora koutou,

As we come to the end of the term, I would like to remind you that we are one of the very best schools in New Zealand. Take a moment to contemplate this. I do not write this lightly or without deep consideration.

Our little college punches well above its weight class in sport, in our academic success, and in our relentless focus on service and character development. We have so many things of which to be proud; our beautiful grounds, deep roots in our community and a commitment to excellence in everything. But for me, as I reflect on my first term with you, what sets us apart, our real point of difference, is our willingness to love and serve others, to be cared for by others in return, and to never be content with "good enough". Thank you to all the teachers, ancillary staff, volunteers and whānau who have worked tirelessly this term to enable our students to be the very best version of themselves. It is through your dedication, support and encouragement that our students experience success and develop as individuals who strive to make a real difference in the world. As you will read about in this newsletter, we have recently been involved in a number of co-curricular activities including a fabulous school formal, Gumboot Friday, Salvation Army food drives and environmental stewardship initiatives. All these activities enable our students to grow in their understanding of what it means to be a deeply conscientious New Zealander. Please accept my very best wishes as you head off on a well-deserved term break. Take this important time to nourish your children with plenty of family activities, important conversations and a few adventures!

Over the next couple of weeks, students are likely to find themselves with more unstructured time than usual. It feels timely to address the pervasive issue of digital devices and social media and the significant role they play in the lives of our young people. Your children's on-line lives may impact on their growth and development in ways that we, as the older generation, are not completely aware. We need to work together to set clear boundaries and establish high expectations of students about making considered choices and becoming positive digital citizens. I encourage you to engage your children in conversation about their use of mobile devices and to monitor their use of the devices and the content with which they are engaging. The risks and rewards of social media need to be carefully managed to eliminate cyberbullying, ensure student safety and to teach our children to ethically negotiate the online environment. A few key points for your consideration:

- Face to face conversation is usually the best way forward, especially when emotions are involved, and the communication is not simple or straight-forward. Talking promotes the development of positive relationships, emotional intelligence and social skills.
- The use of games and some apps can be addictive (e.g. Fortnite) and interfere with healthy time outdoors and socialising with friends and family; so, limit screen time.
- Cyberbullying must be addressed quickly and effectively. As most cyberbullying behaviour happens out of school hours, it is essential that parents address this with their children and are in communication with other parents when the situation warrants. Please be encouraged to speak directly with other parents, even when it takes you well out of your comfort zone.
- There is evidence that the increased use of social media leads to a decline in student resilience and self-esteem (everyone appears happy and beautiful on *Instagram*, real life can never compete). This has been linked to an increase in teenage anxiety and depression.

• The presence of a phone can consume attention and take us away from being fully present with those around us. Model responsible and considered device use.

On that note, I wish you the very best for your term break and look forward to gathering together once again on 29 April to continue our journey together. Please know I hold each and every one of your children in my heart.

<u>School Fees</u>

As our academy classes have started and winter sport approaches, fees will start to be added to student accounts. Bus Route Changes

The Ministry of Education has recently advised changes to the existing bus runs, starting next term. Our bus runs are determined and provided by the Ministry.

As a result of these changes, our Board of Trustees (BOT) is looking at whether there are options available to better service students currently using the bus, and also for students who may use the bus in the future. We will consider whether there are options for some that currently don't catch the bus but would like to.

Families who are eligible to use a bus service should expect contact from the College. The BOT will use the knowledge gained from that to consider ways we can best service the school community.

Updating details

Medical Register - We are currently updating our medical register, if your child has any allergies, asthma, any special medical conditions we should be aware of can you please contact Ms Berry at Student Services.

Email Contacts - We are currently updating our email contacts so we can send out newsletters and notifications to parents via email. If your email address needs to be updated or you haven't provided an email address to the school, can you please contact Ms Berry at Student Services.

Legal Information - We are currently updating our Health and Safety procedures. We are aware of some families who have legal documentation regarding custody, protection etc. Should your child need to have their privacy protected, not be able to be picked up by anyone in particular etc, and you have not already notified the school of these circumstances, please come in and see Ms Berry with the appropriate documentation.

Should there be protection orders in place, we need to know the name of the person from whom children are protected, and ideally a photograph for staff for the purpose of identification. This then means we can activate the appropriate procedures should that person come onto the school grounds. Hopefully this is never needed. However, it is always best to be informed and prepared.


