### Message from the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees

To the Parent Community of Paeroa College.

At the end of last year, we had our scheduled visit from ERO (Education Review Office). We have now received their finalised report and both the staff and the Board have been delighted with the final report which is available on both the ERO and College websites.

A couple of things to highlight. Firstly, the two words used to describe ERO's overall judgement of our performance in achieving valued outcomes for our students: the two words – "Well placed". These words speak to a reality that our community can have ongoing confidence that the governance (BoT) and management (including our staff), at Paeroa College are in a strong position to serve our community into the future.

A second aspect of the review that I'd like to highlight was the time the whole Board spent with the ERO team. It was really encouraging to me as Board chair that through this time of conversation where we shared our thoughts and how we operate etc every Board member actively contributed in a really worth-while manner. It shone through to me that we have a well-balanced Board that is a strong team. Added to this the feedback I received re our staff and a similar strength of team and focus it is hardly surprising that we received such a strong and positive review. My thanks to the Board, our principal and staff and to you, our parent community.

### Student Attendance Procedures

Many thanks to those families who have been working hard to ensure your children attend school regularly. There is a clear and measurable link between attendance and both academic and personal success. You can do your bit by contacting the school via the usual number if your child is ever absent. Please do this to support us as we try to make sure that every student is at school every day. Remember the student who misses one day on average a week, in total, misses almost a whole term in a year.

The Ministry of Education considers regular attendance to be 90%. In a 10-week term, this equates to no more than 5 days absence, for any reason.

If your child is not in school or on a school activity, they are absent, regardless of the reason. This is true even if the absence is *Justified*. The Ministry recognises *Justified* absences to include absences due to short-term illness, bus breakdown, accident, road closure, national/local representation, bereavement, and exceptional family circumstances. Absences can also be *Explained*, meaning that you have notified the school, but the absence does not fall within the Ministry guidelines for *Justified* absences. *Explained* absences include reasons such as: caring for younger siblings, working on assignments, shopping trips, and unapproved holidays during term time. These types of absence are not recognised by the Ministry as being valid reasons for students to miss school.

Family holidays should be arranged outside of school term time, whenever possible. If this scheduling is unavoidable, please request a **leave of absence** in writing from your child's Dean, at least 7 days in advance. The Principal will respond in writing and help facilitate your child's continued learning during the leave. The leave will be recorded for Ministry purposes as *Justified*.

- Student responsibilities:
  - Arrive at school on time.
  - o Attend classes on time and remain in class the entire lesson
  - o Sign in at the student centre if you are more than 10 minutes late for the start of the school day.
  - o Stay within the school grounds. The only students who are to leave during the day are Year 13 students who have signed out at the student centre for lunch.
- Parent/caregiver responsibilities:
  - o Phone or text the school when your child is unable to make it to school.
  - o Whenever possible, avoid scheduling appointments during school hours
  - Personally sign students in and out if they need to leave school during the day for any reason.
  - o Provide a written note, phone call or email to explain student absences on the day or as soon thereafter as is practical.

### **Novel Coronavirus Precautions**

Most of you will be aware of the recent Novel Coronavirus (2019nCoV) outbreak which originated in China. This is a new virus and its specific nature is currently unclear. However, it appears that you can have the virus at an early stage and not show any symptoms. This incubation period is currently considered to be up to 14 days. There have been three confirmed cases in New Zealand to date. However, the likelihood of an ongoing outbreak remains low.

This communication is to reassure you that Paeroa College is monitoring the situation to ensure we do what we can to protect students and staff.

Symptoms of 2019-nCoV are similar to a range of other illnesses and include fever, coughing and difficulty breathing.

Please err on the side of caution if you or a member of your family is unwell.

As always, anyone who is unwell should not be at school. We urge parents to contact Healthline at 0800 611 116 or their GP for medical advice.

Principals can request that a student/staff member with an infectious disease, or who is suspected of having an infectious disease, does not attend.

Please keep an eye on the Ministry of Health website.

We will continue to take advice and guidance from public health authorities and the Ministry of Education on this situation, which at the moment is continuously evolving. Please be assured that we will update you on further important developments, if these occur, through our school communication channels. In the meantime, the <a href="World Health Organisation">World Health Organisation</a> is monitoring this event and its website is a good source of information covering the virus itself, travel guidance advice and questions and answers.



### Blood Donor **ELIGIBILITY** Criteria



First Time Danors Existing Danors

16th birthday up to 66th birthday. Up to 71st birthday.

Regular donors from 71st to their 76th birthday may be accepted subject to authorisation by a NZBS Medical



You must be 50 kg or over.

(if you are a first time donor under 25 years of age, you must also meet the height and weight criteria – tool available at www. nzblood.co.nz/am-l-eligible).



You must be in good health at the time you donate.

You cannot donate if you have a cold, flu, sore throat, cold sore, stomach bug or any other intection.



If you have recently had a tattoo or body plercing you cannot donate for 4 months from the date of the procedure. If the body plercing was performed by a registered health professional (e.g. a Pharmacist GP etc.) and any inflammation has settlied completely, you can donate blood after 12 hours.



If you have visited the dentist for a minor procedure you must walt 24 hours before donating; for major work walt a month.



You must have eaten some food during the four hours prior to donation.



You must bring appropriate identification with you each time you donate.

Acceptable ID is a document which contains

three (3) unique points of personal information. These can be: full name, photograph, date of birth, home address, donor iD/registration number, Workplace (Work ID Cards only).



You must not have lived in the United Kingdom, France or the Republic of Ireland between 1980 and 1996 for a cumulative 6 months or more.

Travel to areas where mosquito-borne infections are endemic, e.g. malaria, dengue and Zika virus infections, may result in a temporary deferral but this will depend on a number of factors, so please check the "Donating after Travelling" tool available at www.nzblood.co.nz to find out when you can donate.



Following pregnancy, the deferral period should last as many months as the duration of the pregnancy.

It is not advisable to donate blood while breast-feeding. Following childbirth, the deferral period is at least 9 months (as for pregnancy) and until 3 months after your baby is significantly weaned (i.e. getting most of his/ her nutrition from solids or bottle feeding). You must not give blood for 12 months:

- Following oral or anal sex with or without a condom with another man (if you are male).
- After engaging in sex work (prostitution) or accepting payment in exchange for sex.
- After leaving a country in which you have lived and which is considered to be high risk of HIV infection (includes sub Saharan Africa and parts of Asic). Full list available at blood donation collection sessions and www.nzblood.co.nz


