

Principal's Message

Ngā mihi mahana ki a koutou katoa, warm greetings to you all,

Learning is in full swing at Paeroa College! Term 3 is an important time for students to focus on their learning experiences, and even more so this year. I want to acknowledge your support as we continue to navigate the challenges presented by Covid. It has been a pleasure to see high levels of attendance and engagement from our students as they endeavour to achieve both personal and academic excellence. It is important that our students continue to focus on all curriculum learning experiences, as each makes a unique contribution to their growth and development. As a school, our focus continues to be on high-quality meaningful outcomes for all learners. This means that every student is focused on, and working towards, outcomes that are connected to who they are and where they see themselves in the future.

Also as we inch closer to the end of year, NCEA continues to be a strong focus for our senior students. We are working in partnership to ensure that NCEA outcomes are in line with each student's goals and aspirations. We look forward to continuing our Home-School Partnership through the HSP meetings on 26 September. Please be aware that this is a compulsory school day and all students are expected to attend at least one learning conference.

Last week's COVID-19 announcement certainly came as an unexpected development. I want to assure everyone that we are following the Alert Level 2 guidelines that have been put in place and that under Alert Level 2, learning should continue as normal for nearly all learners.

Alert Level 2 measures

- At Alert Level 2 it is safe for all students, children and staff to attend school and early learning.
- Children and staff who are at higher-risk of severe illness are encouraged to take additional precautions when leaving home (masks, personal sanitiser etc).
- Please be alert to illness. We are asking anyone who is presenting with cold or flu symptoms to stay home.
- We are reinforcing good hand hygiene and cough and sneeze etiquette.
- Students and staff have been asked to be far enough away from each other so that they are not breathing on or touching each other,
- We have increased the daily cleaning of commonly touched surfaces.
- Physical distancing of 2 metres is recommended for school visitors (to align with public health measures outside the school grounds)
- We have displayed the QR code posters for the NZ COVID Tracer App.

<u>Sports</u>

The WSSSA Executive has made the decision to recommence School Sports Fixtures under Alert Level 2. This is fantastic news, as we know the positive impacts sport has for our students. During this ever-changing time, we want to keep as much normality in our students' lives as it is safe to do. However, with the decision to recommence sport under Alert Level 2, come extra Health and Safety procedures.

The main procedure that has been added is that <u>Secondary School Sport will proceed under</u> <u>Alert Level 2, with all fixtures being Spectator Free</u>. This is to ensure that schools can manage the <u>100-person</u> gathering limit or any other limits placed upon the organisers by venues. This decision is to ensure the safety of the students, team support staff and the wider community. We know how much of a sacrifice this will be for many and the inconvenience this could create. But we ask for your continued support to keep our students, volunteers and community safe by following the procedures we now must implement.

Additional Procedures for sports played at Paeroa College

- No spectators allowed on site (Paeroa College grounds)
- Students to be dropped off and picked up at the Paeroa College bus bay.
- Students will be given arrival time by coach/manager and after the game will be required to change and leave the venue promptly.
- No after match function on College Grounds
- All away game procedures are given to us by the school we are going to and this information is passed on to the appropriate coaches and managers. Relevant information will then be given to students and parents.

Any breach of the procedures put in place will result in the game being stopped and the venue shut down with all required to leave.

Again, I acknowledge the impact this will have on all involved and many of the things we are required to do now are the opposite of what we ask for normally with regard to your support and presence on the side-line. However, the support we need most right now is for each of us to make the required sacrifices to keep our community safe.
