School Day Length

We are seeking community feedback on beginning the school day 15 minutes earlier as from the start of 2021. This would mean classes starting at 8:40AM (currently 8:55AM) and school finishing at 3:00, as it now does. School buses would run on the current timetable. The rationale for this proposed change is to allow us time to hold regular assemblies, meetings with student groups (eg. enviroschools, student council) and follow up on attendance matters in whānau groups without taking time out of lunch or scheduled classes.

2021 Enrolments

It is that time of year when we are finalising plans for the 2021 school year. We are also encouraging families with students whose education was disrupted by Covid-19 and who left school, to consider re-enrolment. It is never too late to make a new start and earn your secondary school qualification. Period Products

As you may be aware, the government has initiated a programme to provide free period products to young women in all schools and kura across New Zealand during 2021. This initiative is designed to reduce "period poverty" and to increase student attendance and equity.

They have taken a phased approach to introduce this initiative. The first step involved a trial run across 15 schools in the Waikato during August and September 2020; Paeroa College participated in this trial. As such, during the last week of Term 3, all female students were provided with a 3-month supply of period products.

As part of the government's assessment of this trial and in preparation for the full roll-out in 2021, they are seeking feedback from whanau and students. We invite you to participate in this feedback by completing an anonymous survey. It is an opportunity for you to have your say in regards to the Government's initiative to provide all schools (from 2021) with the option to receive free period products for all female students.

Wednesday 9th December: Current Year 10 course selection. You will be sent an appointment time which you are welcome to attend with your child.

I feel extremely fortunate that the new Lead School (Employer) for the Hauraki Resource Teachers: Learning and Behaviour service is now Paeroa College as of the start of Term 4, 2020.

Hauraki RTLB is made up of 14 staff that are based in 6 Base Schools across the cluster. Our organisation services 48 schools in the area. We are funded by the Ministry of Education to work together to support the achievement of students in Year 1-10 with learning and/or behaviour difficulties.

The judges loved the attention to detail and care that has been clearly taken when making this garment. The photos and video added to the strength of the entry and the addition of the ghetto blaster as a prop was a nice touch."

As National Senior Winner, Martha has won the grand prize package of;

- Prizepack from Bernina, inclusive of a sewing machine
- \$500 digital voucher from The Fabric Store
- Flights and accommodation to Wellington for 2 to visit the World of Wearable Art Up Close exhibition at Te Papa
- Zoom call with WOW Competition Director Heather Palmer and Head of Competition Kat Sprowell to discuss entry and provide feedback, guidance on design and to answer any questions/provide support.

This year there were over 150 entries, with almost over 400 young student designers from around the country involved. This is the first time Paeroa College has entered Showquest Wearable Arts. Martha completed her entry as part of her Wearable Art Academy class which is held on Fridays for the entire day. Martha worked relentlessly on creating her headpiece, which is absolutely stunning with a large number of handmade flowers. The theme this semester was Baroque Paper Wigs, and Martha really went above and beyond the requirements by creating an entire garment specifically designed for entering Showquest.
