## Principal's Message

Ngā mihi mahana ki a koutou katoa, warm greetings to you all,

The Ministry of Education has allocated Accord Teacher Only Days for all secondary schools to support the implementation of changes to NCEA and the further strengthening of curriculum, progress and achievement practice.

The first Accord day for teachers learning about NCEA changes was held on 19 November 2020 with the second Accord Day this week on Wednesday, 19 May. Two further days have been allocated for later in the year.

Wednesday's focus was on Mana ōrite mō te mātauranga. All teachers spent the day at Te Pai o Hauraki Marae learning and growing together. The intention of this change to NCEA is that Māori culture and learning is given equal importance to European culture in the design of a truly bicultural qualification system. Thank you for your support in giving us this time to ensure teachers are prepared for the NCEA changes that will be taking place over the next several years.

This week is Bullying-Free NZ Week. With the theme 'He kōtuinga mahi iti, he hua pai-ā rau: Small ripples create big waves', this year's week is all about encouraging people to spread the word, take the lead, and make a change.

The week highlights the importance of celebrating our unique talents, appearance, abilities, culture, beliefs, race and gender. It is a great opportunity to remind ourselves and our community that the mahi required to build a school where everyone is welcome, safe and free from bullying is important and never finished. We must work every day to create an environment here at school where all members of our community feel safe, respected and valued, and where bullying does not exist. ## Project week

This week for a combined maths and creatives in schools project week our year 10 students got up close and personal with the Ōhinemuri river.

Monday to Wednesday saw the students do a rotation through 3 separate day activities. Day 1 a day trip with Larn Wilkinson learning about the historical & cultural significance of areas along the river. The second day was with Mike O'Donnell collecting sand from the ocean in Murray River to combine with clay to make their clay tiles as well as walking to the top of the Tarariki spring and learning about the ecological and geographical history of the area. Third day was spent with Juliet Cotterell, a process drama and literacy specialist, who worked with the students through a process drama around a story of The Well.

Then on Thursday students refined short performances for a frozen sculpture museum exhibition and performed for staff members . They also designed the tiles that will be made in the coming weeks with Mike's help and placed around the school. Students composed poetry about water and are working with Kristian Bennett and Winara Levi to set these to music.
