Thanks to all of you who are partnering with us to increase the attendance of every student. The Ministry of Education considers regular attendance to be attending more than 90% of the time. Students who miss more school than this have lower rates of learning and attainment. There is also a direct link between attending school and student well-being and sense of belonging. While there are valid reasons for missing school such as illness or bereavement, these should equate to very few days over the year. It is important to note that any day off school (justified or not) means the student is missing out on important learning.

NCEA CHANGES

What is NCEA and how is it changing?

NCEA (National Certificate of Educational Attainment), the qualification Paeroa College Year 11, Year 12 and Year 13 students work towards has been under review by the Ministry of Education. This review has led to some large-scale changes to make the system easier to understand, fairer and more credible. These changes are currently being trialled in schools across New Zealand. Once the trialling has been completed the changes will be rolled out into all schools including Paeroa College.

Who will these changes affect?

These changes will be coming out in 2023 which means that they will affect our current Year 9 students and any others after that. Our Year 10, 11, 12 and 13 students will not be affected by the changes.

How are we preparing for these changes?

The teacher only days we have had over this year have been preparing staff for these changes. Later this year we will hold a whānau information evening for whānau of Year 9 students to explain what these changes mean for their students learning and future qualifications.

What's happening in the classroom?

This project should be completed during Term 3 and then will have an exhibition open to the community – watch this space.

Semester 1 Academies have finished. Semester 2 Academies start this week with Sports, Sculpture, Horticulture, Maori Performing Arts, Fabric, Café as well as Gateway and Trades.

Enviroschools

The 16th of June saw Paeroa College hosting an Enviroschools Zero Waste Professional Development day for our local area. Ruairi Kelly, our Enviroschools facilitator, ran a great day where the students were given a tour of our local landfill and the Smart Environmental recycling plant in Kopu.

It was enlightening and we had never seen so much rubbish in one place before. It increased our awareness of making good choices around what we do with our rubbish. The next step here at the College is thinking about the ways we can better manage our waste. Thankfully, we have a great group of students who are going to take the lead in some exciting changes that will mean we make some big improvements. Fabric Academy

The Year 12 students in the Fabric Academy have just completed dresses for the charity "Dress A Girl Around the World".
