Thursday 18th November: Year 11, 12 and 13 awards assembly, held during school hours. No spectators allowed.



Exam Leave: Year 11, 12 and 13 students who have achieved their current NCEA certificate by the 18th of November will be eligible for senior leave. This means that they do not need to attend school from this date forward. However, teachers will still be running their classes so students may come along for extra help, revision or to work on gaining an endorsement. During ACA students will receive senior leave letters if they qualify for leave.

Students who have not achieved their current NCEA level by the 18th of November will be expected in school as normal to work on achieving their current NCEA certificate.
