<u>Principal's Message</u>

Kia ora Paeroa College e te whānau,

It is hard to believe we have now finished week 5 of the school year! It has been a busy past few weeks with the ever changing landscape of COVID in our school. In addition to local stressors, I know many of you will be deeply concerned about the situation in the Ukraine. Our thoughts are with those of you affected by the unfolding challenges. We are here to help, please reach out if you could use support. If your rangitahi/young person needs pastoral support related to any current challenges, please remember we have a school counsellor who is available to meet with them. Bookings are through their pastoral Dean or the Student Centre.

The College remains an open and happy place with active teaching and learning programmes in place. We have modified our daily schedule somewhat to keep year levels together and to minimise the number of contacts each student has each day. Evidence is very clear that students' wellbeing and learning is enhanced by being at school with their friends and school staff. Therefore, we encourage all students to come to school if they are well, symptom free and not required to isolate as household contacts.

We have developed hybrid learning so that all students who are not able to be at school, can still participate in the learning journey. If your child is at home and says they have no work to do, they are 100% having you on. Please encourage them to keep up to date by completing work set for them via email, google classroom and HAPARA. If your child is working from home and needs access to wifi or a device to complete their work, please contact their Achievement Dean urgently. Also encourage your children to email their teachers if they have questions about the work they have been set.

Restrictions related to COVID have meant we have not been able to carry out scheduled events such as Year 9 Camp, some parent information evenings and our whānau hui. We have also made the decision to pause our morning Breakfast Club. (However, there continues to be plenty of kai available whenever our students need it.) Please know how much we miss you. We are all working to do the right thing so that our community comes through this challenging period stronger and ever more committed to excellence and equity for **all** Ohinemuri children.

The onus is on each of us to keep ourselves safe so that we keep each other safe. To do this please continue to wear masks, maintain physical distancing and proper hygiene, and follow the rules for isolation if COVID makes its way into your household. We are the sum of our individual choices and actions. Mahi tahi kia kaha.




<u>The Ohinemuri – School Magazine</u>

At the end of every school year, we put together what we call The Ohinemuri – which is the Paeroa College school magazine.


This magazine is heavily subsidised by our local businesses, who by advertising support the cost of the printing of the magazine.
