Principal's Message

It has been a challenging start of the year for our College. In addition to getting to know our new students, we have navigated the arrival of COVID into our community. I would like to thank everyone for your support and perseverance. The success of our "bubble school" format is evidenced by the very low numbers of current COVID cases in our school, and a return to near normal attendance. The College remains an open and happy place with active teaching and learning programmes in place. Evidence is very clear that students' wellbeing and learning is enhanced by being at school with their friends and school staff. Therefore, we encourage all students to come to school if they are well, symptom free and not required to isolate as household contacts.

Once again, the College has done exceptionally well at NCEA, with over 90% of our students earning their NCEA qualifications, well exceeding national averages. Please join me in celebrating the outstanding academic success of our senior students. Our commitment is that each and every student will achieve a robust and rigorous qualification that is well-matched to their needs and aspirations. We continue to work relentlessly towards this goal.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate those 2021 Year 11 through 13 students who gained a Merit, Excellence or Vocational endorsement. A full list of those students is included in this newsletter.

On Wednesday, the Prime Minister announced changes to the COVID-19 Protection Framework which will take effect from 11.59pm today. These changes have implications for schools in regards to vaccine mandates and My Vaccine Pass requirements.

These changes reflect the science and public health advice, and where New Zealand has moved to in our Omicron response. Overall, Hauraki is now a highly vaccinated region. While there are still cases of COVID, the timing for change reflects that we are moving into a post-peak phase.

At this point, New Zealand remains at Red. At Red, there is no change to masks in education settings: Medical-grade masks remain a requirement for staff working indoors with children and young people in Years 4-13. Setting Red will be reviewed by the government on Monday 4 April.

We will continue to focus on keeping our young people engaged in learning and as safe as possible. We are the sum of our individual choices and actions. Mahi tahi kia kaha.

Smoking and Vaping

Paeroa College reminds all families and students that schools are Smoke and Vape-free Zones. Vaping and cigarettes are prohibited by law at all times in all schools (including our grounds and buildings).

Attendance Matters

A student who misses one day on average a week, misses almost a whole term in a year.

Many thanks to those families who have been working hard to ensure your children attend school regularly. We know this is a challenging time for our community but want to reassure you that we have a decreasing number of COVID cases and systems in place to minimise any chance of COVID spread. There is a clear and measurable link between attendance and both academic and personal success.

The Ministry of Education considers regular attendance to be 90%. In a 10-week term, this equates to no more than 5 days absence, for any reason.

If your child is not in school, learning from home as approved by the school, or on a school activity, they are absent, regardless of the reason. This is true even if the absence is *Justified*. The Ministry recognises *Justified* absences to include absences due to short-term illness, bus breakdown, accident, road closure, national/local representation, bereavement, and exceptional family circumstances. Absences can also be *Explained*, meaning that you have notified the school, but the absence does not fall within the Ministry guidelines for *Justified* absences. *Explained* absences include reasons such as: caring for younger siblings, working on assignments, shopping trips, and unapproved holidays during term time. These types of absence are not recognised as being valid reasons for students to miss school.

Family holidays should be arranged outside of school term time, whenever possible. If this scheduling is unavoidable, please request a **leave of absence** in writing from your child's Dean, at least 7 days in advance. The Principal will respond in writing and help facilitate your child's continued learning during the leave. The leave will be recorded for Ministry purposes as *Justified*.

- Student responsibilities:
 - o Arrive at school on time (8:40)
 - o Attend classes on time and remain in class the entire lesson
 - Sign in at the Student Centre if you are more than 10 minutes late for the start of the school day.
 - Stay within the school grounds.
- Parent/caregiver responsibilities:
 - o Phone or text the school when your child is unable to make it to school.
 - Avoid scheduling appointments during school hours
 - Personally sign students in and out if they need to leave school during the day for any reason.
 - o Provide a written note, phone call or email to explain student absences on the day or as soon thereafter as is practical.


<u>The Ohinemuri – School Magazine</u>

Paeroa College- Calculations for Academic Prize Giving

Although it is some ways from now, please see below for information as to how we calculate our end of year awards:

Senior Prizegiving

First in Subject: This is awarded to the top student in each NCEA subject. It shall be awarded to the student with the highest GPA in the subject.

First in Year 11: Students study a total of 13 semester-long subjects that contribute to the achievement of a Level 1 NCEA award. (This includes Semester 1 ACA). First in Year 11 shall be determined using the average GPA for the student's 10 best subjects. Where Level 2 or 3 Standards are included in a subject, they shall be weighted equally with Level 1 Standards.

First in Year 12: Shall be determined as per Dux calculation below but based upon NCEA Level 2 subjects. Where Level 3 Standards are included in a course, they shall be weighted equally with Level 2 Standards.

Dux: The Paeroa College Dux is the top NCEA academic student within the current Year 13 cohort. The Proxime Accessit is the runner up to this award.

The Dux award shall be determined by the Dux Committee. A maximum of 5 NCEA Level 3 subjects will be considered in the calculation of an overall GPA. This could include subjects completed in previous years. Overall GPA will be based on 4.5 subjects. Te Kura and Volcanics subjects can be considered. A minimum of 3 University Entrance subjects (each with a minimum of 14 credits) must be included.

Second and Third places follow this same process and are awarded if GPAs are above 3.0

Calculations of Subject GPA- NCEA Classes

Achievement Standards and Unit Standards are given 4 points for gaining Excellence, 3 points for Merit and 2 points for Achieved. Where a standard is only available at Achieved, 2 points are given for its successful completion. The credit value is multiplied by the point value of the grade awarded for that Standard to obtain a weighted average (GPA). All compulsory internal and external Standards in the course outline will be included in the calculation. This is 14 credits for a full year course, 5 for a semester course, and 8 for an Academy course. Any optional standards will not be included.

Junior Prizegiving

First in Subject: This is awarded to the top student in each subject. It shall be awarded to the student with the highest GPA in the subject. In year 9, arts and technology are treated as a single year-long subject.

First in Year 9: Students study a total of 4 year long subjects and 8 single term rotation technology and arts options. Each year-long course has 16 AMPS points available and each set of Arts options and Technology options also have 16 AMPS points available. First in Year 9 shall be determined using the average GPA for the student's 6 subjects. Literacy and ACA will not be included.

First in Year 10: Students study a total of 4 year long subjects and 4 semester (2 termly) technology and arts options. Each year-long course has 16 AMPS points available and each set of Arts options and Technology options also have 16 AMPS points available. First in Year 9 shall be determined using the average GPA for the student's 6 subjects. Literacy and ACA will not be included.

Calculating GPA

AMPS assessments are given 4 points for gaining Excellence, 3 points for Merit and 2 points for Achieved. The AMPS points value (4) is multiplied by the point value of the grade awarded for that AMPS assessment. This is then divided by the total AMPS points available to give a GPA.

Breakfast Club

This coming Monday, Breakfast club starts up again. It is held in the Pavilion starting at 8.00am – 8.30am.

This is run by our students and members of Paeroa Rotary. We are also sponsored by The Kickstart Breakfast Programme and Kidscan.




