


Course Selection for 2023

Club's

Our Club's programme is thriving here at the College! Our clubs for 2022 include:

Two Dungeons and Dragons Clubs. These two clubs are supported by 3 teachers. One club runs on a Thursday with 2 separate groups. It has a year 11 group of 5 students and a year 12/13 of group of 7 students. There is also a year 10 group of 6 students on a Wednesday. Moving forward, the club will be looking at getting some funding to purchase some dice and laminated maps.


LGBTQ Support group. This has been available at Paeroa College for two years now. They meet once every two weeks at lunchtime and enjoy a time to talk through any issues they may be having as well as generally enjoy camaraderie. Membership is fully confidential. Up to 15 students attend.

Robotics Club. This club meets on Thursday lunchtimes and is a group totalling 10 students from year 9-11. They enjoy building, programming, and controlling a VEX robot. This gives practical students a creative outlet, as well as fuelling interest in coding classes. Not everyone can participate at once, as they only have one robot and it is not possible to engage more than 5 people in building a robot at once, as only 2 can feasibly have their hands on the robot at a time. This robot was purchased with funding from the Right to Learn Trust managed by Perpetual Guardian. The club will likely seek funding to expand at a later stage. In future, the club would like to compete at inter-school robotics competitions.


Drama Club is a group of 7 year 9 & 10 students, and they are currently meeting once a week on Tuesday lunches. It allows for a continued meeting place for students passionate about acting. They are currently working towards putting on a 'Mini Production' of a selection of scenes from Grimms Fairy Tales. They hope to perform this in Term 4.

Pottery Club is a group of up to 15 students who meet after school on a Wednesday for around 2 hours. They fashion different items and practice different techniques under the talented expertise of Mrs Dunser. Moving forward the pottery club needs to have its own clay and may charge a fee for this, in a similar way to how sports team charge fees. Other options such as pottery shows are being considered as fundraisers as well. **Movie Club** has been proposed this term and had its first meeting. It is great to see students show initiative and start a club.

This annual club fundraiser starts on Friday 7th of October which is rolling around quickly.

This year we are starting a wee bit earlier (the end of the first week in the school holidays) This will mean that for all those kids, teenagers

For those who have not been down there before. Panekiri Station is a 9000ha government owned hill country farm. It is located southeast of Lake Waikaremoana, bordering the Waiau River for a good distance and includes the Waihi power station. It farms over 20,000 ewes, so about 30,000 lambs! and over 2000 angus breeding cows.

We run two crews operating on different areas of the station. We stay in the shearers quarters.

Essentially so long as the weather is ok - WE DOCK LAMBS and the more fine days we have the quicker the job is done.

Huge thanks to those who have made contact so far- it really is appreciated.

You don't need to have had experience docking lambs before – it's a case of many hands make light work and with everyone chipping in to help it certainly makes for a real social atmosphere and a great way to help out on both fronts - as an excellent club fundraiser and also helping the team down on the Station.

Parents and helpers for preparing meals etc are also welcome.

All you need to bring is some farm clothes, a sleeping bag and a willingness to work as a team and the rest just falls into place. The meals and food are all provided by the club. Car pooling and transport can also be arranged if need be.
