#### Principal's Message

Tēnā koutou katoa,

Welcome to Term Two which is filled with many exciting activities, traditional events, curriculum delivery, internal assessment, and the excitement of winter sports practices and games.

I hope you managed to have some high-quality family time over the term break and that your children have arrived rested and ready for the term ahead. No doubt, as a whānau, you will soon find yourselves caught up in the winter routine of supporting your children in their various cultural and sporting activities and reassuring and encouraging them as they work on assignments with deadlines looming. Our teachers are looking forward to meeting with you and your child on our Home-School Partnership Day Wed 10 May. The conversations you have with your child's teachers on this day are key to their success. We know every child will thrive when we work together. Please schedule these meetings promptly so that you do not miss out.

As you may have heard in the news over the term break, the Government is delaying the requirement for schools to be teaching the refreshed NCEA Level 2 and 3 subjects by one year in order to put the immediate focus on numeracy and literacy. As was already planned, from 2024, there will be new numeracy and literacy tests that a student must pass in order to achieve any NCEA qualification. These tests are being piloted for year 10 students this year at Paeroa College. However, the announcement indicated that for 2024, there will be additional pathways available for students to demonstrate their literacy and numeracy proficiency.

The latest communications have informed us that the new NCEA standards are being rolled out to schools in phases, with the current plan seeing all schools teaching the fully refreshed curriculum by 2027. The NCEA Level 1 changes are scheduled to be fully implemented by 2024, NCEA Level 2 by 2026 and NCEA Level 3 by 2027.

I want to assure you that Paeroa College and the Ōhinemuri Kahui Ako (Community of Learning) are prioritising literacy and numeracy in our curriculum design while also ensuring every child has access to rich and exciting learning in all curriculum areas.

As always, I am committed to an ongoing positive reciprocal relationship with you. I love having a chat along the side lines of the sports fields. Please feel welcome to get in touch and share whatever is on top for you!

#### Year 9 Camp

Last term saw the Year 9s going on their first Paeroa College camp. It had taken a while to organise the camp due to the poor weather at the start of the term and the teachers strike day. However, on Thursday 30th and Friday 31st March the Year 9s set out from school to attend Waharau Regional Park in Whakatiwai.

On this trip students were able to take part in a variety of different challenges that included raft building, frisbee golf, rope work and building a natural sculpture. The activities were designed to get the students working with different people in a team and show manaakitanga and resilience. All students enjoyed coming together in the evening for some awesome kai followed by taking part in a Burma Trail.

Though it was a quick trip away, the students enjoyed coming out of the classroom environment and taking part in some unusual, physical mahi. Being outside of the classroom meant that students were able to develop their relationships with each other, as well as with the staff involved. It is an experience that we will not forget, and we look forward to other camp opportunities in the future.

#### Creative Cats Academy

On Monday 3rd April the Creative Cats Academy attended a performance of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'. The production was performed by students at Waikato Diocesan School for Girls in Hamilton and was an enjoyable evening for the students. The play was an update of William Shakespeare's text which had a 21st Century makeover.

The performance was a musical based on the style of punk set in the 1980s. All students gained experience watching live theatre and seeing what can be achieved with a play which was written in the late 16th Century. Seeing this production will help our Academy students to build awareness of the theatre and how to act to a large audience. The Creative Cats are looking forward to channelling this knowledge into their own devised work.



#### Duke of Edinburgh

Over the school holidays we had students take part in their Silver Qualifying Duke of Edinburgh expedition. One took part in their Bronze practice.

They worked as teams cooking their own meals, camping in tents and hiking through some challenging tracks around Maratoto.

On the first day they walked the 4x4 Wires track up to the Hut. On the second day the hiked the old wires track or the donkey steps. They saw the old holding pens for the animals, the old wires that were the communication between coasts during the war. They camped in a different location. On the final day they walked to see the big slip at Golden Cross and finished by hiking from Hikutaia to Paeroa along the rail trail.

For their gold expedition, these students need proper hiking boots. If you are clearing any old footwear out, and have some spare ones, we would be grateful.

#### School Jackets

Paeroa College is lucky enough to be part of the Kidscan Programme. This means we are gifted hooded jackets to be used as school jackets at no cost to our students.

Each student is entitled to receive one of these jackets. Please make sure it is named. Should a student lose their jacket, we have 2<sup>nd</sup> hand jackets in the original school design (no hood) available to be used or there is the option to purchase a new original jacket for \$75.00.

These can be ordered through the normal school uniform purchasing system. The Kidscan jackets are <u>unable</u> to be purchased. We cannot sell these jackets due to Kidscan rules.

The only way a student can receive another Kidscan jacket is if they have outgrown their existing one. Therefore, they would then bring the smaller item back to be swapped for a larger one.

## Attendance Matters

A student who misses one day on average a week, misses almost a whole term in a year. There is a clear and measurable link between attendance and both academic and personal success.

Please work hard to ensure your child attends school every day. The Ministry of Education considers regular attendance to be 90%. In a 10-week term, this equates to no more than 5 days absence, for any reason, including illness and other justified reasons.
