Principal's Message

Kia ora e te whānau,

I hope this letter finds you well. This term has been filled with many action-packed days, learning opportunities and student achievements. You will, undoubtedly, be aware that winter sports are coming to an end and that we have several teams away on Tournament Week. We have (so far) had some notable successes, with our Lacrosse team coming away with the Waikato Silver medals, and several of our teams doing well in Thames Valley competitions. I am writing from sunny Hamilton where I am lucky to be spending the day supporting our Open A netball girls in the Upper North Island competition. Our basketball teams are also currently away on tournament and we wish them well.

Many thanks to all of you who took the time earlier this term to attend the Home-School Partnership (HSP) meetings with your children. These conversations are so important and I am grateful to all of you for prioritising them. I would also like to acknowledge the many written contributions that were made to the Board of Trustees through our *Community Input Surveys*. Your thoughts are essential to the strategic direction of our school and will inform the Board's conversations as we put together our strategic planning documents for the years to come.

In our *Community Input Surveys*, it was incredibly heartening how many of you expressed your appreciation regarding the communication you receive from school. That has been a key focus for us this year and it is really exciting to learn that you appreciate it. In addition, several of you highlighted the new HSP format as a real positive. We initiated this new format in response to research in neurobiology that demonstrates the importance to adolescents of having key adults in their life. It is our intention that your child's House Group teacher will be one of those key people for the duration of the time they spend in college. Please also continue to reach out to your child's subject teachers especially when and if you have any concerns.

A couple of you mentioned the school lunches, overwhelmingly as a positive. How cool is it that our children are provided with a free and healthy lunch every day! A few of you did mention wanting an opportunity for students to provide feedback on the lunches they receive. I would like to assure you that we do collect student feedback in the form of regular surveys (through their school email addresses). In addition, our incredible lunch ladies are eager to hear from students in terms of their likes and dislikes. Students are welcome to pop up to the window after lunch is served and discuss options and ideas with our warm and welcoming staff.

We are currently involved in planning for a refurbishment of the Pavilion (an original school building). This will provide students with an additional warm and dry space in which to relax and eat during lunch time in the winter months.

As a final note, in week 9 of this term we will be celebrating Te Wiki o te Reo Māori, Māori Language Week. Our eagerly anticipated annual Haka (and waiata) Wars will take place on **Tuesday 12 September at 2:10pm** in the Hall. All students and staff will be involved in this exciting event and you are warmly welcome to come watch and support your favourite house in this House Competition. I look forward to seeing you there.

Internet Access

The Ministry of education has secured funding to extend internet connectivity for up to 18,000 learner households currently without internet connectivity until 30th June 2024.

Eligibility:

- Eligibility is for households with primary and secondary students, that currently do not have an internet connection
- Internet connections are fully funded until 30th June 2024, including install, WiFi modem and monthly costs
- Schools provide student details, address, and household contact information to MoE
- The Equitable Digital Operating Service (EDOS) will work with providers to identify the best connectivity option for the family's location
- EDOS whānau tech helpline provides dedicated support with common technical issues they may need help with for learning online

Special Assessment Condition Changes for 2024

We would like to inform you about the important change regarding Special Assessment Conditions (SAC) for the coming year. SAC conditions are available to meet a range of physical, emotional, sensory, medical, and learning needs.

For this year(2023) Paeroa College has to apply for SAC conditions through New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA). However from next year, the kura can notify NZQA that ākonga from year 11 are using SAC conditions. No supporting evidence will be needed to be submitted to them.

SAC conditions remove barriers for ākonga to complete school work. This change aligns with the Universal Design for Learning, which promotes accessibility in education.
