<u>Principal's Message</u>

Tēnā koutou katoa,

We have had a successful round of HSP interviews to start the term and I want to thank all those parents who took the time out of their day to engage with these. The partnership between home and school when strong is known to help students maximise their learning potential. I encourage all our students to work on the areas highlighted in these interviews and through the progress reports. Term two is a time to settle into the work and make significant progress towards achievement goals, especially for students undertaking NCEA assessments.

Winter sports are now well underway. We have had some pleasing results across a range of codes and once again thank you to all the coaches, managers and parents that make these sports possible. Educational research is saturated with data around the benefits of involvement in team or group based extracurricular activities. What we often refer to as the soft skills such as communication, problem solving, collaboration and dealing with conflict are developed through such activities. Students participating in these activities generally speaking tend to have significant improvement in these skills due to their participation.

The new phone rules have made a positive change to both the classroom environment and break times. I appreciate all those students who have made the adjustment to the new rules and are working with the school to ensure we comply with these changes. A reminder that those students who have their phones placed in a Yondr pouch three times will need their parents to come in and collect their phones from one of the Deputy Principals.

As winter sets in and the mornings are getting colder this can make students more reluctant to attend school. I can only continue to encourage students to keep up with regular attendance. This is one of the most significant indicators for student achievement. Regular attendance ensures that students are up to date with their learning, that new learning is consolidated and that they are best prepared for assessments. If transport to school is an issue, please notify the dean as Paeroa Community Trust has partnered with the College and can collect students who need a lift to school.

Keep up the good work and we are looking forward to a busy but fruitful Term Two.

Cell phone Policy

Students are not allowed to bring their phones to school and will need to leave these at home. Parents wishing to contact their child can do so via the school office or student centre.

If a student is caught with their cell phone out during the school day and does not have an approved exemption then the phone will be placed into a Yondr pouch and locked. If they have a smartwatch this will also be placed into a Yondr pouch and locked. These are to remain locked and in the possession of the student for the duration of the school day. Students can unlock these on their way out of school at the end of the day using the Yondr unlocking stations that are located in the student centre and DP office. If a student is caught with their phone out three times, then a parent or guardian will need to collect the phone from the school and this will be collected from the DP's office.

Students who wish to apply for an exemption can do if they meet the following criteria:

- a phone is needed for health reasons (for example, to monitor insulin levels); or
- a phone is needed to help a student with a disability or learning support need (for example, to assist with impaired communication); or
- the principal decides that they are needed for special circumstances (for example, the student is a teenage parent).

Students at Paeroa College will not require phones for educational purposes as they are already issued with a Chromebook. Applications for exemption can be made using the "Cell phone exemption" form which is available from the student centre.
