Principal's Message

Tēnā koutou katoa,

Firstly, I want to say thanks to all those students who continue to regularly attend school and engage in the lessons prepared for them. We have celebrated those students who have had 100% attendance in Term One and will continue to do this as the year progresses. A wide range of research shows that attendance is one of the major contributing factors when it comes to students' academic performance. We have also seen an improvement on the percentage of students attending school more than 80% of the time in term one this year compared to 2023, well done to these students.

As winter sets in, attendance can become more of a challenge with the number of bugs and sickness going around. If your child is unwell then please do keep them at home rather than spread illness. Cell phone Policy

Students are not allowed to bring their phones to school and will need to leave these at home. Parents wishing to contact their child can do so via the school office or student centre.

If a student is caught with their cell phone out during the school day and does not have an approved exemption then the phone will be placed into a Yondr pouch and locked. If they have a smartwatch this will also be placed into a Yondr pouch and locked. These are to remain locked and in the possession of the student for the duration of the school day. Students can unlock these on their way out of school at the end of the day using the Yondr unlocking stations that are located in the student centre and DP office. If a student is caught with their phone out three times, then a parent or guardian will need to collect the phone from the school and this will be collected from the DP's office.

Students who wish to apply for an exemption can do if they meet the following criteria:

- a phone is needed for health reasons (for example, to monitor insulin levels); or
- a phone is needed to help a student with a disability or learning support need (for example, to assist with impaired communication); or
- the principal decides that they are needed for special circumstances (for example, the student is a teenage parent).

Students at Paeroa College will not require phones for educational purposes as they are already issued with a Chromebook. Applications for exemption can be made using the "Cell phone exemption" form which is available from the student centre.
