Thanks to all of our students who helped to make this occasion a success.

I would also like to congratulate the multiple sports teams that have had tremendous success so far this year. Well-done to the Motor Cross team on a fantastic victory recently and also to our Netball, Basketball and Rugby teams who have made finals. This is a great credit to the students involved and their commitment to the teams. I want to thank all those people who have responded to the proposed enrolment scheme for Paeroa College. The final scheme will be in place for enrolments for 2025 and will allow the College to better manage student numbers and make sure that we have the appropriate spaces to be able to continue to provide a quality education for all of our students.

We have a range of improvements happening in and around the school grounds. During the school holidays we had an archgola installed that allows students to have additional cover during wet lunchtimes. We have also purchased a range of outdoor furniture that will provide students with additional areas to sit. There are also additional water fountains to be installed and a significant upgrade to both the school orchard and the science/horticulture garden area. These improvements will all help to improve the visual look of the College as well as the facilities available to our students. Thanks to the Board of Trustees for approving these projects and having the vision to improve our physical environment.

Finally, I wish to acknowledge Mrs Amy Hacker the Principal of Paeroa College from 2019. As you will be aware she has decided not to return in 2025. Currently the Board of Trustees is working through the process to recruit a new principal. Thank you to all those who have completed the surveys that were sent out to gather community input to the process. The process will take some time and we hope that the new Principal will be in place for the start of Term One 2025.

After consultation with the Board, we have developed a proposed enrolment scheme for Paeroa College under section 72 of the Education and Training Act 2020.

The enrolment scheme could affect which school a student will be entitled to enrol in, or school transport entitlements.


Kapahaka 2024
