Catch Up Day

Just a reminder that on the last day of each term this year we will be running catch up days. The first catch-up day was very successful and allowed the staff to spend time with students who needed more time to complete their learning.

These days are designed to help all students who need to catch up on assessments and learning to have time to do so. On these days the school will remain open, but the timetable will not run.

Classroom teachers will identify students who need to catch up on NCEA assessments or AMPS tasks and these students will be required in school on this day.

Students who do not need additional catch up will have two options:

1. Attend school and work in a supervised space.

2. Work from home.

Students in Year 9 and 10 will have online literacy and numeracy tasks to complete, while students in Year 11, 12 and 13 will focus on NCEA assessments.

As we near the end of each term you will receive an emailed letter if your student is required to attend the catch up day.

BYOD & Devices

Paeroa College uses N4L (n4l.co.nz) networking to manage a students' ability to access harmful online material. Here are the key aspects of N4L's monitoring systems:

Fire walls- This acts as a wall between the internet and the school's network, allowing the good stuff through, and keeping the bad stuff out. The firewall prevents a huge number of online threats and malicious activity from reaching school systems and devices. Learn more about this on their website.

Web Filtering- Helps prevent staff and students from accessing inappropriate websites or apps. Filtering rules can be customised for your school to block entire categories (e.g. games), specific websites (e.g. YouTube), particular apps and known VPNs (Virtual Private Networks). Find out what you need to know about online safety & web filtering on their website.

DDoS Protection- A Distributed Denial of Service (DDoS) attack is when a network gets deliberately bombarded causing it to slow down or crash, preventing users from accessing resources on the network or the network itself. DDoS protection identifies and mitigates malicious DDoS activity before it impacts the school.

As a school we also use a platform called Hāpara. This is similar to google classroom with some added extras. Student online learning will be placed on a workspace in Hāpara. Teachers are able to view a student's activity during school hours. This platform allows teachers to see what tabs a student has open, open tabs for them to access, comment on what they are doing and lock them into the tabs that they need them to be on. This is not able to be used outside of school hours when a student is logged on with their personal log on.
